Trip Information Package Mount St. Louis Moonstone's Education Program

2009/2010

Mount St. Louis Moonstone is adopting **the use of Helmets for all Students** participating in a school visit. Simply translated, **no student** will be allowed on skiing and riding slopes if they are apart of an official school function **without a helmet**. The most important message, however, is that students ski and ride within their limits and obey the Alpine Responsibility Code. Students who wish to challenge the code with their decision on the hill will lose their privilege of skiing/riding for the day.

Mount St. Louis Moonstone's Education Program provides lessons, rental and a fantastic learning environment for school groups. Our focus is on safety and fun. A part of Mount St. Louis Moonstone's Education Program requires that everyone take a one-hour group lesson regardless of ability with our certified CSIA or CASI instructors.

Mount St. Louis Moonstone has fire, ambulance and hospital facilities within minutes of the Resort. Emergency 911 services are also available. Our trained, certified ski patrols are on staff to assist with any injury or accident. Mount St. Louis Moonstone also has cafeteria facilities for your convenience.

Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort opens daily at 8:00 am with the Lifts opening at 8:30 am closing at 4:30 pm (closed Christmas Day, December 25).

Your program price includes: lift ticket & lesson, helmet and equipment rental (if required).

Each school group must arrange their own transportation. We also ask that you organize the collection of money and make one single payment.

The Grade 5 Snow Passport Lift Ticket and the Air Miles Program cannot be used in conjunction with the Education Program.

The Outback Terrain Park and Outback Super Pipe are off limits to all participants. Leashes are also mandatory on all snowboard equipment (rental equipment have leashes).

It is important that students dress for winter. Winter jacket, winter pants, gloves, mitts and helmet are essential. Please insure students are properly dressed and prepared for unexpected weather.

Planning your trip to Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort Ltd

Arranging your trip:

1. Obtain permission from your principal. Then proceed with establishing preferred dates. It is a good idea to have an alternate date(s) in the event of a snow day.
2. Arrange for transportation.
3. Call, email or fax Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort to reserve your date(s).
4. Send home permission forms to parents. Have money collected and permission forms signed and returned to the school.
5. Discuss with the students the Alpine Responsibility Code their behavioral expectations, and the organizational plans for the day. **Remind your students that all students require helmets.** Participants must attend "Park Education and Awareness" presentation before access is given to the Junk Yard Terrain Park and Junk Yard Super Pipe. The Outback terrain park and the Outback Super Pipe are off limits to Education participants.
6. Collect all money and submit one Cheque, Visa or Master Card (if paying by credit card a 2% service charge is automatically added to the final balance) to Mount St. Louis Moonstone guest services on the day of the trip. For accounting purposes, payment must be received on the day of the trip. Your payment will include the total of your school's lesson/lift tickets and rentals. Please do not submit funds in advance.

2. Your confirmation from Mount St. Louis Moonstone will confirm date(s) along with your rental forms, please fill in the rental forms ahead of time and bring them with you to the Resort on the day of your trip.

Planning your trip to Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort Ltd Cont'd

Arrival:

1. When the bus arrives at Mount St. Louis Moonstone, the teacher in charge will advise Guest Services and obtain lift tickets for the entire group. Students will remain on the bus. It will be the teacher's responsibility to distribute the tickets accordingly.
2. A Representative from our Snow School or Ski Patrol will board the bus and conduct a brief safety overview of the day.
3. Teachers/Supervisors will bring students renting equipment to the rental shop. Those students who have their own equipment can proceed to the ski-off area.
4. Beginner lessons start immediately after leaving the rental shop. All intermediate and advanced skiers/boarders/bladers must go through an initial ski-off to determine the appropriate level of lessons where they will then receive a colour sticker. Intermediate and advance level lessons will follow. An opportunity to upgrade the colour sticker will be given during the second ski off, schedule in the afternoon.
5. **Important on Hill Procedure**

Upon completion of the ski-off and receiving your advanced sticker, you must participate in a "**Park Education and Awareness**" presentation if you are interested in skiing/riding the Snowboard Parks. This brief information session will highlight Park Safety and Etiquette. Most importantly, students will receive a **Park Access Sticker** for the day.

No sticker, No entry to Junk Yard Terrain Park and Junk Yard Super Pipe!

Once you have been informed of the Park Education and Awareness Information and you have your Park Stamp, students will participate in their **scheduled lesson** of the day.



Trip Checklist

1.	Gain Principal's permission to bring your school/class to Mount St. Louis Moonstone to participate in our Outdoor Education Program.	
2.	Once permission is given, reserve transportation for your trip.	
3.	Call, email or fax Mount St. Louis Moonstone to reserve your date(s). (It is a good idea to have an alternate date in the event of a snow day.)	
4.	Send home permission forms to parents. Have money collected and permission forms signed and returned to the school minimally one week prior to your trip.	
5.	Arrange to bring a cheque from your school on the day of your trip. Ensure the appropriate signatures are on the cheque.	
6.	Go over the Alpine Responsibility Code that was sent to you with your students along with any other behavioral expectations for the day of your trip. Reminder to students that helmets are mandatory for all participants and day lockers are available to rent. If students are buying lunch we recommend that they bring \$15/\$20	
7.	One week prior to your trip, call the Resort to obtain your block of rental numbers. Please complete your rental forms before your arrival at the Resort.	
8.	Two days prior to your trip, contact the Trip Coordinator at Mount St. Louis Moonstone to confirm your final numbers (number of people attending, plus the number of rentals required). Send in your rental forms by fax or email.	
9.	Day of your trip: Bring your form of payment (Cash, Cheque, Debit, Visa, or Mastercard,) plus your rental forms. 2.5% service charge added when paying by C/C	
10.	When you arrive at Mount St. Louis Moonstone: Students remain on the bus; Teachers/Supervisors proceed to the Guest Services desk to notify arrival and obtain tickets.	

General Information:

1. Rates are based on a minimum school group size of 25 students. One complimentary lift ticket and rental package is given for every ten students for the teachers/supervisors who attend and help with the trip. **The maximum ratio for the complimentary package is based on the number of students attending the day of the trip.** (i.e. 50 students present, 5 complimentary allowed)
2. The School is responsible for equipment that is lost, stolen, damaged or not returned to the rental department. In the event of an emergency and the renter is unable to return the equipment, please notify the rental department as soon as possible.
3. If you need to cancel your trip, please notify us as soon as possible. In the event of weather related cancellation and the decision to cancel is not made until the morning of, you may call the Toronto Toll Free 877-835-2112 or 705-835-2112 ext 200 and leave a message.
4. Teachers are responsible for the supervision of the students on and off the slopes of Mount St. Louis Moonstone. Please direct your efforts to making this a valuable learning experience.
5. Students may bring their lunches or lunches maybe purchased in our cafeterias.
6. Students can switch from snowboarding or skiing, but a second lesson is required at the cost \$11.00.

Filling out your Rental Forms

There are separate rental forms for skiing, snowboarding and snowblading. Clearly print all information requested on the appropriate rental form(s) for each student based on their choice of skiing, snowboarding or snowblading. The following information is required:

- Student's first and last name
- Height
- Weight
- Ability (see type listed on the rental form)
- Age
- Students will be asked their shoe size

Blocks of rental numbers are required prior to your arrival, so please call Toronto Toll Free 877-835-2112 or 705-835-2112. When you have received your rental numbers write/type the numbers down the left side (rental # column) filling in each line from top to bottom (total of 25 lines), please continue to fill in the student's name, height, weight, ability and then stopping at the age column. If you have someone that cancels after you have written on the form, please neatly draw one single line through that person's name and use the next available number.

Alpine Responsibility Code

Like any activity, there are some rules of the road.... etiquette to follow. Everyone's goal is to have a fun, educational and safe experience. We provide the safe environment for you to enjoy. There are inherent risks with skiing and snowboarding with many factors affecting your demeanor of the slopes: snow conditions, weather, snow features and lifts to name a few. Understanding your limitations and abilities within the elements ultimately affect your personal safety. Awareness of physical conditions is the key. There is a code of ethics, which has been established by the National Ski Area Association, that covers skiers and snowboarders alike. The prudent things to do are become familiar with them and conduct yourself accordingly. Failure to follow these steps may result in loss of skiing/riding privileges.

The Code

There are elements of risk that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Regardless of how you decide to use the slopes, always show courtesy to others. Please adhere to the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

1. Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid other people and or objects.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
4. Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look up-hill and yield to others.
5. If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
6. Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment
7. Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
8. Keep off closed trails and closed areas.
9. You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.
10. You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.
11. Parents or guardians are responsible for their children's activities on resort property.
12. Non-participants avoid disrupting ski and snowboard classes by skiing through them.

This goes for racecourses as well.

This is a Partial list - Know the code – be Safety Conscious – It is Your Responsibility!

Please read the disclaimer on the back of the lift ticket. Sample below:

Notice to all Users of these Facilities ~ Exclusion of Liability ~ Assumption of Risk ~ Jurisdiction ~ these conditions will affect your legal rights. Please Read Carefully!

As a condition of use of the ski area facilities, the Ticket Holder assumes all risk of personal injury, death or property loss resulting from any cause whatsoever including but not limited to: the risk, dangers and hazards of skiing, snowboarding and other recreational activities: the use of ski lifts, collision with natural or man-made objects or with skiers, snowboards, or other persons; travel within or beyond the ski area boundaries; or negligence, breach of contract, or breach of statutory duty of care on Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort Ltd and its employees, agents, representatives, sponsors, successor and assigns *hereinafter collectively referred to as "the ski area operator"). The Ticket Holder agrees that the ski area operator shall not be liable for any such personal injury, death or property loss and releases the ski area operator and waives all claims with respect thereto. The Ticket holder agrees that any litigation involving the ski area operator shall be brought solely within the Province of Ontario and shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of the Province of Ontario. The Ticket Holder further agrees that these conditions and any rights, duties and obligations as between the ski area operator and the Ticket Holder shall be governed by and interpreted solely in accordance with the laws of the Province of Ontario and no other jurisdiction.

The Ski Area Operator's Liability is excluded by these conditions. Please adhere to the Alpine Responsibility Code and be responsible for your own safety in all activities.



Note to Parents and Students

_____ School is arranging a trip for students to ski or snowboard at **Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort**. This signed form is required for all students who wish to participate in the Outdoor Recreation and Ski/Snowboarding Education Program.

Mount St. Louis Moonstone's Education Program requires that everyone take a one-hour group lesson regardless of ability with a certified CSIA or CASI instructor. All students must go through an initial ski-off to determine the appropriate lesson level and recommended ski/riding terrain. For the safety of our visiting students and the skiing/boarding public, **Mount St. Louis Moonstone's** progressive sticker system controls where each student skis or rides. In this agreement, the term "skiing" shall include "snowboarding" and telemark skiing and "we" shall refer to 'participating student and his/her parent(s)'. **All students are required to wear helmet.**

Assumption of Risk

We are aware that skiing involves many risks, dangers and hazards and we assume all risk of personal injury, death or property loss resulting from any cause whatsoever including but not limited to the inherent risks of skiing, the use of ski lifts, collision with natural or man-made objects or other skiers, travel within or beyond the ski area boundaries, or negligence, breach of contract, or breach of statutory duty of care on the part of **Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort Limited** and its staff. We agree that **Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort Limited** and its employees and agents shall not be liable for any such personal injury, death or property loss and release **Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort Limited** and its employees and agents and waive all claims with respect thereto. **Mount St. Louis Moonstone Ski Resort Limited** requires you know and obey the Alpine Responsibility Code. Skiers must always Ski Under Control and be able to stop to avoid collision with other skiers or objects. **Leashes** are also **mandatory** on all snowboards (rental snowboards have leashes). Cross-country ski poles are **not** allowed at **Mount St. Louis Moonstone**.
