REPORTS TO: Snowmaking Shift Lead, Snowmaking Supervisor

PURPOSE OF THE JOB

Under the direction of the Snowmaking Shift Lead or Snowmaking Supervisor, the main purpose of the position is all duties relating to snowmaking, equipment maintenance, and plant operation.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- ❑ Set up of Snowmaking guns and hoses in a proper and safe manner
- ❑ Operate snowmaking equipment in a proper and safe manner
- ❑ Check and move guns at regular intervals to maintain optimum efficiency of guns, system and trail coverage
- ❑ Watch for and respond to any hazards that may result from snowmaking
- ❑ Respond to any system or environmental changes as they occur during snowmaking
- ❑ Report any unsafe conditions to Snowmaking Shift Lead or Snowmaking Supervisor
- ❑ Maintain and promote good communication with fellow snow crew
- ❑ Operate snowmobile in a safe manner according to SOP
- ❑ Perform tasks as set out in the training manuals set out by the Snowmaking Department
- ❑ Ability to communicate well and take directions, Problem solving
- ❑ Responsible for the cleanliness of the work & lunch areas
- ❑ Work independently or as a team with others
- ❑ Assist in other departments as required
- ❑ Read, understand and comply with Company policies and procedures
- ❑ Other duties as assigned

SKILLS & EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- Weather interpretation to maximize snow production
- Snowmaking equipment operation
- Lift Evacuation training or experience
- Good communication skills
- Read & write English and able to differentiate between colours

PHYSICAL & TIME REQUIREMENTS

- Day Shift Hours 0700 – 1900
- Night Shift Hours 1900 – 0700
- Be on call and available, if required, on days off
- Follow lunch, washroom and break procedures as directed

- Work outdoors, sometimes in extreme weather conditions
- Physically fit and able to lift, push and pull heavy loads; willing to ask for assistance when required
- Lift up to 40 lbs, assisted lifts with anything over 40 lbs
- Stability to walk on uneven surfaces and icy conditions
- Ability to ascend/descend a ladder and comfortable working from heights
- Ability to stoops, kneel, crouch to work on snowmaking equipment
- Communicate, converse with and exchange accurate information with fellow crew members and other departments in a polite and professional manner
